Rotations end, troops return

About 70 Airmen of the Delaware Air National Guard came home to the New Castle ANG Base on Sunday, July 7 and Tuesday, July 9, for a joyful reunion with over a hundred loved ones.

They completed deployments that began in late February to Southwest Asia combat zones where they served under the 386th Air Expeditionary Wing to support Operation Enduring Freedom.

The Airmen are the last group of a contingent of about 100 unit Airmen who served up to 120 days under U.S. Air

Force Central Command, operating their aircraft in several nations in the region.

The returning 166th Airlift Wing Airmen included C-130 aircrew and crews who maintained the aircraft.

In early May two previous groups of fellow unit Airmen arrived home after serving in the same location in SWA.

Act before August 1, 2013 to transfer education benefits to avoid added service commitment

All of our Guard members, especially our traditionals, need to know about the eligibility requirements and changes regarding transferring Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits and required service obligations attached to this transfer of benefit.

An important change is that members who are close to 20 years of service or more than 20 years of service may transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to a spouse or dependents while incurring a less than a four year additional service commitment.

However, as of August 1, 2013 all transfers will incur a four year additional service commitment. Details here: http://gibill.va.gov/benefits/post_911_gibill/transfer_of_benefits.html.

Air Guard submissions under review for DNG History Book

Wing HQ personnel are reviewing submissions made for the Delaware National Guard History book project, covering the period from the morning of Sept. 11, 2001, to the end of 2012.

The submission deadline for Air Guard content was July 8, 2013.

If any unit needs to polish up their material with final review/editing or make vital last minute additions, now is the time to do so. Please finish up by the end of the July UTA.

The project relies upon units to supply their own material and tell their own story. No one knows better than the uniformed members of a specific unit the importance and uniqueness of their missions, or know which ones ought to be highlighted for posterity.

The project is intended to give a fair shake to each unit in the Delaware Guard — Army and Air — and is coordinated by a task force at Joint Force Headquarters, Delaware National Guard.

The endeavor will result in a book of about 180 pages dedicated to Delaware Guard history. The welcome mat was put out for each section, flight, squad-

ron and group in the wing to submit their unit contributions. Wing staff offices and Delaware Air Guard HQ will also be asked for input.

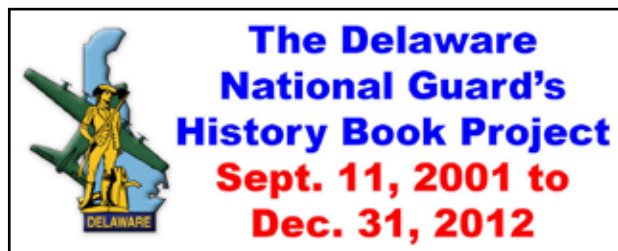
Your point of contact is your unit public affairs representative. Your unit com-

mander or first sergeant can direct you to him/her, or whomever the unit appointed as the project POC. Squadrons were asked to contribute an average of one page per year of content (text and high-resolution photos, with subjects/event/location/date identified in writing).

Our Adjutant General, Maj. Gen. Frank Vavala, wants the story told of the evolutionary growth and development of the Guard from a strategic reserve to an operational asset in the post- 9/11 era.

Colonel Mike Feeley, commander of the 166th Airlift Wing, said, “Each wing unit will contribute to this great opportunity to tell our history. Have some fun, seize the moment, and make it worthwhile.”

The project advisor and editor-in-chief is retired Brig. Gen. (Del.) Ken Wiggins. He has researched and written several books on Delaware Guard history.

Over 80 civilians coming to “Bring a Friend to Drill Day” on Sunday, July 14

Over 80 civilians from many walks of life will get a view of military life in the Delaware Air National Guard as guests of current members during the unit’s first “Bring a Friend to Drill Day” on July 14.

The event’s purpose is to expose military eligible civilians to the many career opportunities available in the Delaware Air Guard.

For half of a day on Sunday during a weekend military drill, the civilian guests will tour a C-130 aircraft, hangars and shop areas, watch Airmen per-

form a variety of jobs, and hear subject matter experts talk about their part-time military experience. The guests will be exposed to Airmen who have successfully obtained a higher education, completed Air Force technical schools, and gained promotions. Their visit will conclude with a bar-b-cue lunch in an outdoor picnic area.

“Most of the attendees signed up are young adults, in the age range of 18 to their late 20s, so we expect a lot of questions about how they can gain a college education, get trained, and navigate military careers,” said Senior Master Sgt. Mike Davis, recruiting and retention superintendent of the Delaware ANG.

“We want people in our community to know that they can serve locally while pursuing their civilian dreams.”

The “friends” attending the half-day event are sponsored by family members, neighbors or friends who presently serve in the Delaware Air Guard. Registration for this event is closed, as pre-registration ended last month.
