



Reason to complete the DEOCS Organizational Climate Survey

The fundamental reason leaders seek to assess an organization's climate is because the climate-positive or negative-will influence the organization's success. In a military setting, this is usually described in terms of "readiness" or "mission accomplishment."

DODD 1350.2 maintains that leaders will assess their organizations' Equal Opportunity climate on a regular basis and -- importantly -- that they are responsible for that EO climate.

Obtaining an accurate snapshot of the organization's climate is best accomplished by having its members provide their frank and honest perceptions about the way the organization is run and how they are treated. Moreover, progressively higher participation rates

provide a more accurate picture of the organization's climate.

Leadership of the 166th Airlift Wing has a genuine concern for you, and it is important for them to know your honest perceptions and opinions. In the absence of this data, leaders are not in a position to recognize, address, and resolve problems.

The 166AW's Organizational Climate Assessment is currently open and will close after the October drill weekend! This survey is a confidential, command-requested development survey focusing on issues of equal opportunity and organizational effectiveness and takes approximately ten minutes to complete. It is important to remember that the DEOCS is an anonymously-administered instrument that can be completed from any computer with Internet access. You don't need to use

your Common Access Card (CAC) and you don't need to use a government computer.

You will be prompted for your unit-specific password and the survey will begin. You must complete the entire survey upon initial entry.

Our leadership is willing to listen to your concerns, entertain your suggestions for improvement, and follow through with concrete actions intended to improve conditions and morale.
